BPro[®] Reimbursement

The USPSTF determined in 2015 that 24-hour ABPM should serve as the reference standard for blood pressure measurement.*

In 2021, The US Preventative Service Task Force recommended BP screening and obtaining blood pressure measurements outside of the clinical setting for diagnostic confirmation before starting hypertension treatment. ("Class A" preventative recommendation).

Affordable Care Act

The ACA requires that non-grandfathered group health plans and health insurance issuers or individual health insurance coverage provide preventive services, including evidence-based items or services that have a USPSTF "A" or "B" recommendation rating.

Patient Population Under Consideration

This recommendation applies to adults aged 18 years or older without known hypertension.

Screening Interval

The USPSTF recommends annual screening for adults aged 40 years or older and for those who are at increased risk for high blood pressure.

Ambulatory BP monitoring may also be suitable in other situations, such as for:

- Pregnant women with hypertension.
- People with "borderline" hypertension.
- Difficulty controlling BP with medication.
- BP changes due to other drugs.
- Changes in prescription medications that may impact BP.
- Fainting episodes or hypotension (low BP).

Commercial Payers

Blue Cross Blue Shield (BCBS) of Alabama, BCBS Illinois, BCBS North Carolina, Tri-Care, Aetna, Cigna, certain medicare supplements and HMOs. The reimbursement range is \$59 up to \$181 based on available reimbursement data.

Auto Dictation BPro

The patient has a history of elevated blood pressure readings in the office/ clinic, and complains of dizziness, syncope, chest pain, and or shortness of breath. Will plan on 24-hour ambulatory blood pressure monitor to determine daily variations for comparison with the readings documented in office visits to determine if this is truly hypertension and whether interventions are necessary. Follow-up to be determined based on 24-hour BP monitoring.
